# DIRECTIONS TO MONIKA AND KEN'S HOUSE 8551 PINE RIDGE DRIVE

Plan A

From old downtown Rogers (intersection of W. Walnut St. and 2<sup>nd</sup> St.) [large Coca Cola mural on side of building] –

Go north on N. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street about 1/3 rd mile to W. Locust St./AR Hwy.12 [new Harps store on corner]

Turn right (east) onto W. Locust St./AR Hwy. 12 and continue east for about 7 miles until you cross the bridge over Beaver Lake.

Just past the bridge you will pass a condominium complex on the left, and just past the condominium complex, turn left onto the first road you come to on the left which is Pine Ridge Lane [just beyond Pine Ridge Lane there is an old bus stop painted green with "Pine Ridge Estates" on the side and across the street to the right is the entrance to Graystone.

Take Pine Ridge Lane about 3 car lengths to a Tintersection and turn right (which keeps you on Pine Ridge Lane)

After about another 3 car lengths, the road forks – stay on the main road which is Pine Ridge Lane to the left and up the hill.

At the top of the hill, you will come to another Tintersection with Pine Ridge Drive

Turn right onto Pine Ridge Drive and continue until you almost drive into someone's garage – Don't drive into that garage! It's not ours.

Instead, before you drive into the garage, turn left into a gravel cul-de-sac that is just past a black mailbox with 8551 on it.

Pull around and park in the gravel cul-de-sac and walk down the concrete drive between the two brick light posts at the far edge of the cul-de-sac.

Friday we took a back road to Taos, NM and to Santa Fe, NM. It was a drive to remember. Over the mountain the temperature dropped to 22 degrees. Aspen trees had lost their leaves and we were a little surprised that there was very little snow on the mountains. In Santa Fe our goal was to visit the Lorreto Church. (See photos on next page.) This church has a free standing, two-revolution spiral stairway. It was built in the 1860's. If you desired, you could view and buy the many jewelry and pottery items made by the local people.

Then it was on to Tucumcari, NM for an over-night stay. Lots of brown hills and trucks on I-40.

Saturday we found a relative in Oklahoma City and enjoyed watching Oklahoma football as they soundly whipped Nebraska. A delicious steak dinner was prepared for us and there was lots of car talk as well as football talk.

## Wiederkehr Wine Fest Days


